PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT HIGHLIGHTS

- The Professional Development Committee was unable to hold its CFRE Refresher Course as planned due to COVID-19. However members of this resourceful group responded to the virus with virtual Zoom-tables.
- Members responded well to the virtual opportunities to share, teach, and learn with others several times during the last three quarters of 2020. The annual Grants Workshop was held, but also became a virtual event thanks to the gracious efforts of the U.W. Memorial Library.
- The Chapter Mentoring program stayed on track with its program, nimbly changing course to bring mentors and mentees together via technology.


